

# Our Specialties

While NPIP has expertise in the organizations listed below, we consider a wide range of organizations and evaluate each individually for eligibility and fit.

## Associations

Support services for groups that are associated by a common purpose, interest, or goals. Associations may include social, civic, business, and professional organizations, as well as clubs.

## Camps

Manage day, overnight, or seasonal retreats for educational, religious, or recreational purposes to participants of various ages. Camps with fewer than 3 high-risk activities are acceptable.

## Cemetery/ Funeral Services

Cemetery associations that provide maintenance, funeral, and administration services. Professional liability coverage not typically included for cremation and mortician type services.

## Chambers of Commerce/ Community Development

Encourage development of individuals and businesses by presenting them with opportunities and promoting tourism in their community.

## Churches

Spaces for individuals who share a common faith to gather for the purpose of celebrating their beliefs and paying homage to their deities. Members may also perform outreach and services to their communities.

## Community Action/ Multi-service Agencies

Assist communities by administering a combination of human services, such as food, emergency shelter, transportation, utility assistance, health services, and more.

## Community/ Senior Centers

Social and entertainment facilities for their target classes of participants that may include meals, classes, or recreation.

## Counseling/ Life Coaching

Offer mentoring, guidance, and educational programs to enhance the quality of life of those they serve.

## Early Childhood Development

These centers supervise preschool and enrichment daycare programs, and offer resources to parents on topics such as school, family, and success.

## Educational Services

Deliver learning services for all ages on aspects of life that contribute to social functionality, leadership, family, safety, and well-being. Does not include K-12 schools or colleges.

## Educational Institutions

Nonprofit independent schools, including Charter Schools and colleges. Does include k-12 schools or colleges.

## Elderly Care/ Disabled Care

Provide respite, in-home, or center care for the elderly or disabled including housekeeping, transportation, emergency response, and other services aimed to improve quality of life and maintain independence.

## Environmental/ Animal Preservation

Environmental preservation groups generate community involvement in protecting and restoring endangered natural resources. Animal service groups include rescue, shelter, and humane societies.

## Food Banks/ Food Services

Deliver food distribution and nutritional programs to those in need.

# Our Specialties

## **Foundations/ Trusts**

These groups are established to raise or furnish money for services, programs, scholarships, home ownership, education, or social outreach.

## **Galleries/ Museums/ Theaters**

Centers that make exhibits, activities, historical sites, or programs available to community members for educational or entertainment purposes.

## **Healthcare Centers/ Low-Income Community Healthcare**

Supplies medical, dental, mental health services, and referrals for low-income patients. Medical Malpractice Liability Coverage is excluded – NPIP provides premises liability only.

## **Hospice**

Deliver care and services to terminally ill adults.

## **Housing (Low Income)**

Offers education, financial, and housing options to low-income community members.

## **Housing/ Water Associations/ Camping Clubs**

Manage the water, common areas, or recreational/camping facilities available to their members.

## **Job Training/Placement/ Vocational Rehab**

Support individuals, including those with disabilities, through job placement, training, mentoring, application assistance, and employment referrals.

## **Recreation Programs/ Sports**

Put on activities for both children and adults, including after-school programs.

## **Senior Services**

Assist the elderly with guidance and support to help maintain their quality of life and independence, including transportation, nutrition, housing, etc.

## **Shelters/ Missions**

Run safe havens for the homeless and victims of abuse. Some members also provide clothing, food, life skills, and spiritual services.

## **Substance Abuse**

Provide treatment and rehabilitation services to those with alcohol or chemical dependency. Does not include detox centers.

## **Transportation**

The primary focus of these groups is to provide transportation options within their communities.
